As the school year is coming to its last week, we wanted to thank each and every one of you for your continued support of both your child's learning and the wider school. We have been delighted that we have been able to host parents in school almost every week, through parent sessions in class, family learning events, performances, etc and your support is invaluable.

Just the last 2 weeks alone, we have hosted 2 parent sessions (year 1 and 4) and 3 music concerts for parents/carers. This is in addition to the events with our children. In the last 2 weeks, all of our year 3 children have taken part in a sponsored litter pick in the local area; our Year 4 girls cricket team represented South Yorkshire in the Yorkshire Cricket Finals at Headingley Stadium in Leeds; all of our year 5 children attended their last swimming session at Dearne Valley; several of our year 5 and year 6 children represented our school and won the pyramid cricket tournament at Sir Thomas Wharton, 56 of our children in year 6 have taken part in Bikeability lessons and finally all of our year 6 children have attended their transition days at their new secondary schools.

Next week, we are inviting parent/carers of year 1 and year 4 into their last class enterprise events of the year and we will also be welcoming the parents and carers of our year 6 pupils to

their leavers event on the evening of Thursday 18^{th} July 2024 to celebrate their time at Warmsworth Primary School.

Parent Questionnaires

Thank you to those of you who returned your parent questionnaires - we received a huge 359 questionnaires back! Your lovely comments have been shared with staff as a whole, and we are very appreciative both of your support and for taking the time to give us such positive feedback - it is greatly appreciated! Please find the results of this questionnaire attached, along with some responses to the main comments received. We always listen to feedback, and, where possible, we try and act on it; class teachers may have spoken with you directly, and some comments we have discussed as a wider staff team and have agreed some whole school changes.

Annual Report to Parents

Children from nursery to year 5 will have brought their school annual report home with them today - we hope you were able to take the opportunity to meet your child's new class teacher after school too. If your child in in FS2, Year 1, Year 4 and Year 6 there will also be their results of the statutory assessments they have taken at the end of this school year in their envelopes. (Year 6 will be bringing their reports and SATs results home on Monday, when all the children are back in school from their secondary school transition visits.)

Curriculum Focus - Personal Development

When we analysed the parent questionnaires that had been returned, we noticed that the percentage of parents who stated that they agreed that the school supported their child's wider personal development was lower than the others. The development of the whole child is very important to us at Warmsworth Primary School. We focus on personal development every day in school, and it is woven through all we do; whether that is through our Personal Education curriculum, our daily personal development assemblies, our school visits and visitors, our after-school clubs, our free music tuition for our children in KS2, our pupil leadership opportunities, our subject-related theme days etc, our fund-raising support for local, national and international charities, or our daily interactions to support the visions and values of our school. Developing the whole child is at the centre of what we do.

For several years, our children have been involved in community projects; our year 3 children have contributed to keeping our local area tidy through conducting a litter pick, our year 4 have promoted recycling with their uniform Swap-Shop, year 6 have donated food from their SATs breakfast to the local foodbank and as a whole school we have supported numerous charities with non-uniform days etc.

For next academic year, we have decided to formalise the support of these community events into our curriculum, as shown below, with each year group having their own community-focused event to support. We hope you will continue to support out ventures, as in previous years.

Reminder: Important Changes for children's Leave of Absence from school in term time, including holidays

Please see the information below that we shared in our latest newsletter:

We have received some guidance from Doncaster Local Authority on the new Department for Education statutory guidance that comes into force from 19th August 2024.

We have been advised that from 1^{st} September 2024 the following changes will apply:

- In the first instance of unauthorised absence of 5 days or more, there will be an increase in the rate of a Penalty Notice Fine rising from £120 to £160 per parent per child, if paid within 28 days OR rising from £60 to £80 per parent per child, if paid within 21 days.
- In the second instance of unauthorised absence of 5 days or more within 3 years, a second Penalty Notice Fine will be issued to the same parent(s) for the same child(ren) within a rolling 3-year period. This will be charged at a higher rate of £160 per parent per child with no option for this second instance to be discharged at the lower rate of £80.
- In the third (or subsequent) instance(s) of unauthorised absence of 5 days or more within 3 years, the Local Authority will consider the use of another tool, such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions in response.

I am sure you will all join me in sending her our best wishes and look forward to hearing all about her celebrations on her return. After the summer holidays, we will also be welcoming Mrs Lewis as one of our year 1 teachers, Miss Ball, as a Higher Level Teaching Assistant and Mrs Perry as a teaching assistant. We are currently in the process of recruiting another member of support staff as a THRIVE practitioner, to replace the vacancy left by Mrs Durrant, earlier this term.

We hope the sunshine comes out for the next 6 weeks, and hope everyone has a great time over the summer holidays.

We look forward to seeing everyone return safely to school at 8.50am on Tuesday 3rd September 2024.

Mr Halstead is employed to deliver after-school sports clubs and any other teachers who may do these, eg. choir, are done on a purely voluntary basis. When we have looked at other providers of after-school activities, their charges to parents are very high, which is something we are acutely aware of minimising at the current time.
